At the regularly scheduled meeting of the Montgomery Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) on January 24, 2019 at 11:30 a.m. at the Montgomery Intermodal Conference Room 495 Molton Street Montgomery, Alabama, the aforementioned members were present.

Agenda Item 2: A quorum assessment, with 10 voting members present; and 2 Proxies. The MPO Meeting began 11:32 A.M. Mr. Jinright conducted the meeting.

Agenda Item 3: Introduction of Guests: Mr. Josh Kervin, New Southeast Regional Engineer - ALDOT),

Agenda Item 4: Minutes from the previous MPO Meeting (Action) The Minutes from the previous MPO Meeting, one edited, to show Mayor Powell attending the meeting; after corrections were done, a motion was made by Mr. Bollinger to accept and adopt the minutes and seconded by Mr. Gillespie.

Agenda Item 5: FY 2016-2019 TIP Amendments (Action Item) Mr. Smith provided the update:

- Page 2: An Elmore County Commission project for Resurfacing on Coosada Parkway from Alabama River Parkway; North to SR 14. A distance of 5.72 miles, the funding source will be Surface Transportation Program Montgomery (STPMN) Funds. The federal match will cover \$944,000 and local match \$236,000 total funds \$1,180,000.
- Page 3: A Montgomery County Commission project for Resurfacing on Hyundai Blvd (CR-42) from US-31 to US-331; a distance of 2.70 miles. The funding source will be Surface Transportation Program Montgomery (STPMN) Funds; a distance of 2.70 miles. The federal fund match will cover \$959,280 and local match \$239,820 and total cost \$1,199,100. * This amendment is for a cost reduction in the amount of \$400,000. The \$400,000 will be reallocated to the next two Montgomery County projects.
- Page 4: Is a Montgomery County Commission project for Resurfacing and traffic Striping on Anderson Road/ Lower Wetumpka Rd (CR -74 and 75) from Alabama River Parkway to US 231; a distance of 5.1 miles. The funding source Surface Transportation Program Montgomery (STPMN) Funds. The federal funds will cover \$1,039,480 and local match \$259,870 and total cost \$1,299,350. *This amendment is for an increase of \$100,000 based on final bid costs. The amount of increase is coming from reallocated funds on the previous page.
- Page 5: A Montgomery County Commission project for Resurfacing and traffic striping on Snowdoun Chambers Road from Hobbie Road to Woodley Road; a distance of 5.38 miles. The funding source Surface Transportation Program Montgomery (STPMN) Funds. The federal funds will cover \$990,880 and local match \$247,720.00 total cost \$1,238,600.00. * This amendment is for an increase of \$300,000.
- Page 6: A Montgomery County Commission project for Resurfacing and Traffic Striping on Alabama River Parkway (CR-2120) from end of Toll Bridge over the Alabama River to the Montgomery City Limits; a distance of 1.68 miles. The funding source will be Surface Transportation Program Montgomery (STPMN) Funds. The federal funds will cover \$445,520 and local match \$111,380 total cost \$556,900.*

Page 7: A City of Montgomery project for Shared Use Path on Maxwell Boulevard from Holt Street to Coffee Street/ Eugene Street; a distance of .41 miles. The funding source Surface Transportation Program Montgomery (STPMN) Funds. The federal fund match will cover \$120,000 and local match \$30,000 total cost \$150,000. * This is a new project. PE will include surveying and traffic modeling.

After discussing the TIP Amendment projects and all are in balance; a motion was made by Mr. Gillespie to accept and adopt all projects and seconded by Mr. Beyer; the agenda item passed unanimously and without any further discussion.

Agenda Item 6: Walk Bike River Region (Final Draft): The Walk Bike River Region is the active transportation plan for the Montgomery MPO; prepared by our consultant Mr. Ian Samson. This plan builds on past planning efforts and forges a path for the River Region to develop a comprehensive, safe, comfortable and fun walking and biking network. This plan will be used by the MPO and local governments to prioritize, fund, and implement high quality infrastructure, high-impact programs, and supportive policies. Based on public input, feedback from stakeholders the Final Draft has been approved, a motion was made by Mr. Beyer to adopt the Plan and seconded by Mr. Miller; therefore the agenda item passed unanimously and without any further discussion.

Agenda Item 7: Interstate 14: (Informational)

I-14 will begin in west Test (I-10) and end in Augusta, GA (I-20). Alabama section can begin along US 84 or US 80, connect to I-65 leading to Montgomery, connect to I-85 leading east, and finally connect Louisiana, and Mississippi created a congressional caucus to promote the expansion of Interstate 14 and to introduce the necessary legislation to authorize that expansion. The benefits of the I-14 will connect a significant number of military installations, seaports, major cities, and large highways to each other.

Agenda Item 8: Transportation Project Status (ALDOT)

- (Elmore County) A project for Intersection improvements and bridge replacement on SR-14 @ SR-143. CSX bridge complete, working on phase I Mortar Creek estimated completion date February 2019.
- (Montgomery County) Resurface I-85 from end of 6 lane at Taylor Road to the Macon County Line; scheduled to be complete November 2018.
- (Montgomery County) Resurface I-85 from East Bound to Taylor and Interchange improvements at Eastern Boulevard; estimated completion date May 2019.
- (Autauga/Elmore) Traffic signal system upgrades on Cobbs Ford Road from the intersections of Silver Hills Drive to the I-65 interchange (NB lane ramps) east of Prattville. (project has started)
- (Autauga County) Bridge culvert replacement on SR-6 (US-82/Prattville Bypass) over Pine Creek in Prattville; work has begun, scheduled to be complete November 2019
