- Page 4: City of Prattville Project for Sidewalk Improvements along Old Ridge Road in City of Prattville, a distance of 1.96 miles. The funding source will be State of Alabama Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) Funds. **The Federal funds will cover** \$800,000 Local Match \$200,000 Total Funds \$1,000,000.
- Page 5: City of Montgomery Project for Downtown Streetscape Improvements along East Jefferson Street in Montgomery; a total distance of 0.1 miles. The funding source will be State of Alabama Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) Funds. The Federal funds will cover \$551,360 Local Match \$137,840 Total Funds \$689,200
- Page 6: A State of Alabama project for Access Modifications Along SR-3 (US-31) from CR-4 to SR-6 (US-82); a distance of 1.2 miles. The funding source will be National Highway System Funds. The Federal funds will cover \$120,000 State Match \$30,000 Total Funds \$150,000.
- Page 7: Elmore County Commission Project for Widening, Leveling, Resurfacing, and Traffic Striping on Willow Springs Road from Jasmine Hill Road to Redland Road; a total distance of 1.96 miles. The Federal funds will cover \$280,000 Local Match \$70,000 total funds \$350,000 (This is a proposed cost increase from \$285,000 total cost (\$228,000 federal / 80% and \$57,000 local match /20% to \$350,000 total cost (\$280,000 federal/80% and \$70,000 local match /20%. \$65,000 total cost increase (\$52,000 federal cost increase).

Page 8: Autauga County Commission project for Widening, Resurfacing CR-27 from SR-14 to CR-29 and on CR-29 from CR-27 to SR-14; a total distance of 5.6 miles. The funding source will be MPO Dedicated STPMN Funds. The Federal funds will cover \$647,000 Local Match \$161,000 Total Funds \$809,000. This project was originally programmed into the adopted TIP and is shown in the TIP Constraint Table, but was never put into the ALDOT project management system after adoption and given a project number. ALDOT wants it reapproved and included on the MPO resolution so that construction can be let in February 2023.

After the discussion of the TIP Amendment Projects, a motion was made by Mr. Calhoun to adopt and accept the projects, following a second by Mr. Gillespie. Therefore the agenda item passed unanimously and without any further discussion.

- Agenda Item 6: MPO-ALDOT Performance Measurements/ Targets Resolution FY-2023 (Action Item)
 Mr. Smith explained the Montgomery MPO Resolution Adoption of New and Amended Performance Measures and Targets FY -2023 federal regulations require that the Metropolitan Transportation Plans(MTP's or LRTP's) and Transportation Improvement Programs (TIP) include Performance Measurements and Targets for urbanized areas; and the Metropolitan Planning Organization, in coordination with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Alabama Department of Transportation (ALDOT) has reviewed the requirement to adopt Performance Measures and Targets for use in the transportation process as required. Details of the performance measures and targets were as follows:
- FHWA Safety Performance Measures (PM1): Number of Fatalities, rates of fatalities, number of serious injuries, number of non-motorized fatalities
- FHWA Bridge/Pavement Performance Measures (PM2): % of pavements of the interstate system in good condition/bad condition, non-interstate NHS in good condition/bad condition, poor condition
- FHWA System Performance Measures (PM3): % of person-miles traveled on the Interstate that are reliable, % of person miles traveled on the non-interstate NHS that are reliable, truck travel time reliability (TTTR) index on the interstate
- FTA Transit State of Good Repair Performance Measures:% of Rolling Stock (Revenue vehicles) meet or exceed Useful Life Benchmark (ULB), % of Equipment (over \$50K) meet or exceed useful life benchmark (ULB), % of FTA Funded facilities with condition rating below 3.0 (average) of FTA Average Term Scale
- FTA Transit Safety Performance Measures: Fatalities, rate of fatalities, injuries, rate of injuries, safety events, rate of safety events, mean distance between major mechanical failure.

After the discussion for the Performance Measurement Target Resolution FY-2023; a motion was made by Mr. Gillespie to adopt and accept the resolution following a second by Mr. Calhoun. Therefore the agenda item passed unanimously and without any further discussion.
