The funding source will be Surface Transportation Program Maintenance Funds (STPMN)(CARBON REDUCTION FUNDS CAN BE USED)

After the discussion of the TIP Amendment Projects; a motion was made by Mr. Donaldson to adopt and accept the current projects following by a second by Mrs. Ott. Therefore the agenda item passed unanimously and without any further discussion.

Agenda Item 6: Approval of Draft 2023-2027 MPO Congestion Management Plan by Sain Associates

• Mr. Smith stated that after the MPO approved the Draft Congestion Management Plan at the March meeting that no changes had been made to it. He further said that a public meeting was held along with a 14 day public comment period with public review available and that the document was final and for approval. A correction was added to ensure that the intersection of

Pike Road, Wares Ferry Road and SR-126 and US-80 was included. Mr. Smith confirmed with Mr. Gilliam if that project was in the document he said that it was but further said that those changes would be reviewed and if needed changes would be made. Mr. Smith asked Mr. Gilliam if he had anything new to present. He said that he did not.

After the discussion of the Final Draft, a motion was made by Mr. Reeves to accept the draft; following a second by Mrs. Ott. Therefore the agenda item passed unanimously and without any further discussion.

Agenda Item 7: New Carbon Reduction Funds Available for Carbon Reductions Projects (Information Only)

Mr. Smith discussed Carbon reduction funding program for the state and funds allocated to the MPO. He said that it is a 5-Year Carbon Reduction Program overall. He said that the funds came from the U.S. Department of Transportation Federal Highway Administration Estimated Funding for the Carbon Reduction Program Under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law. He said that the funds must be programmed/obligated and used within each year. The State of Alabama has a Total of \$128,343,911 of funds that has been allocated for the program. The MPO received \$885,105 in FY-2022 and has \$902,808 in funds for FY-2023 for a total of \$1,787,913 funds available for programming for carbon reduction related projects. Mr. Smith said that the funds could only be used for non-roadway projects like bicycle and pedestrian projects and transit projects only. Mr. Smith said that he recommended that TAC members identify what they wanted to spend the funds on by submitting projects ASAP before the year ended.

Agenda Item 8: Follow-Up on MPO Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure Funds Discussion and Consideration Decision on Where Charging Station will be located (Information Only)

No decision has been made on the charging station as of yet. A location on where to put them have not been determined. The funds have to be obligated by September 24, 2024.

Agenda Item 9: Transportation Projects Status Update (ALDOT) (David Bollie)

- U.S. 31 at the West Blvd is 40% near completion.
- U.S. 31 at Hyundai Blvd almost complete
- The asphalt work on Jackson Ferry Road is about 95% complete working on punch list items
- The additional lanes on US-82 at Highway 14 is about 90% complete, working on punch list items
