After the discussion of the TIP Amendment projects a motion was made by Mr. Thompson following a second by Mr. Stone. There was a motion to amend the TIP Amendments, to move the projects from one physical year to the next year, those projects are on pages 2 -11 which are to be considered for inclusion in the FY-2024-2027 and not automatically included as proposed. Mr. Gillespie made the motion to amend, following a second by Mr. Willis. The motion passed as amended.

Agenda Item 6: Approval of Draft 2023-2027 MPO Congestion Management Plan (Sain Associates) (Paul Gilliam)

• Mr. Smith stated that after the MPO approved the Draft Congestion Management Plan at the March meeting that no changes had been made to it. He further said that a public meeting was held along with a 14 day public comment period with public review available and that the document was final and for approval. A correction was added to ensure that the intersection of Pike Road, Wares Ferry Road and SR-126 and US-80 was included. Mr. Smith said that those changes would be reviewed and if needed changes would be made.

After all corrections and edits were made a motion was made by Mr. Gillispie to adopt and accept the final Draft for FY 2023-2027 Congestion Management Plan following a second by Mr. Thompson. Therefore the agenda item passed unanimously and without any further discussion required.

Agenda Item 7: New MPO Carbon Reduction Funds Available for Carbon Reduction Projects (Information Only)

Mr. Smith discussed Carbon reduction funding program for the state and funds allocated to the MPO. He said that it is a 5-Year Carbon Reduction Program overall. He said that the funds came from the U.S. Department of Transportation Federal Highway Administration Estimated Funding for the Carbon Reduction Program Under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law. He said that the funds must be programmed/obligated and used within each year. The State of Alabama has a Total of \$128,343,911 of funds that has been allocated for the program. The MPO received \$885,105 in FY-2022 and has \$902,808 in funds for FY-2023 for a total of \$1,787,913 funds available for programming for carbon reduction related projects. Mr. Smith said that the funds

could only be used for non-roadway projects like bicycle and pedestrian projects and transit projects only. Mr. Smith recommended that MPO members identify what they wanted to spend the funds on by submitting projects. He said that the TAC had been given instruction on doing this.

Agenda Item 8: Follow-Up on MPO Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure Funds Discussion and Consideration Decision on Where Charging Station would be Located (Action/Consideration) No decision has been made on the charging station as of yet. A location on where to put them have not been determine. The funds have to be obligated by September 24, 2024. More Information have to be researched.

WHEREAS, the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) of 2021, preceded by the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act of 2015 and Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21) continues the Federal Highway Administration requirement from SAFETEA-LU that MPOs must apply the Congestion Management Process in Transportation Management Areas (TMAs); and

WHEREAS, the MPO has identified roadway corridors and roadway locations in the Montgomery MPO Transportation Planning Area where traffic congestion must be addressed; and

WHEREAS, the MPO has produced a Congestion Management Process and Plan utilizing effective congestion management and operational practices to mitigate and manage congestion within affected areas and continue to use all available means to reduce congestion within the Transportation Management Area and projected growth areas of the Montgomery MPO Transportation Planning Area; and

WHEREAS, consistent with the above provisions and those of the Montgomery MPO Public Participation Plan, the MPO has properly advertised and reviewed public and agency comments and finding the foregoing satisfactory; now

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Montgomery MPO hereby adopts the Draft 2023-2027 Montgomery MPO Congestion Management Process & Plan.

#### Montgomery Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) Resolution Adopting The Final 2023-2027 Congestion Management Process & Plan

WHEREAS the Montgomery Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is the organization designated by the Governor of the State of Alabama as being responsible, together with the State of Alabama, for implementing the applicable provisions of 23 USC 134, 135 (amended by the FAST ACT Sections 1201, 1202 July 2012); 42 USC 7401 et seq.; 42 USC 5303, 5304; 23 CFR Parts 450; 40 CFR Parts 51 and 93; and,

WHEREAS, the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) of 2021, preceded by the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act of 2015 and Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21) continues the Federal Highway Administration requirement from SAFETEA-LU that MPOs must apply the Congestion Management Process in Transportation Management Areas (TMAs); and

WHEREAS, the MPO has identified roadway corridors and roadway locations in the Montgomery MPO Transportation Planning Area where traffic congestion must be addressed; and
