Agenda Item 5: FY 2024-2027 Montgomery MPO TIP Amendment(s) (Action Item)

- Page 2: (City of Prattville) Project Description Traffic signal upgrades at East Main Street at South Washington Street Intersection, East Main Street, at South Northington Street, and East Main Street at South Chestnut Street. The funding source will be Carbon Reduction Program. **(CRP) Federal Funds will cover \$1,014,091 Local Match \$253,523 Total Funds \$1,267,614. This amendment combines the three**

Carbon Reduction Program funded projects for the City of Prattville that were approved by the MPO in May 2025 into one project. Total federal for each project was \$143,546 for East Main Street at South Chestnut Street, \$430,975.76 for East Main Street at South Northington Street, and \$439,569.16 at East Main Street at South Washington Street intersection. Total federal funds \$1,014,091.

After the discussion for the one TIP Amendment, a motion was made by Mrs. Sankey to adopt and accept the agenda item, following a second by Mr. Newman Therefore, the agenda item passed unanimously and without any further discussion.

Agenda Item 6: Final Draft FY-2026 UPWP: Action Item)

Draft FY-2026 UINIFIED PLANNING WORK PROGRAM (UPWP BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS SUMMARY)

- \$1,035,910 in Federal Highway and Federal Transit Administration Planning (PL) Federal Funds Only. \$ 517,995 in FY 2026 apportionment funding: \$461,054 unused carryover funds from FY -2025 available for FY-2026.
- Total FY-2026 Final UPWP budget estimate is \$1,294,888 with \$1,035,910 federal and \$258,978 local match, funding includes two (2) planning projects.
- MPO Planning Area New Plans:
 - a. Year 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Update (\$200,00 federal; \$50,000 local match).
 - b. Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan Update (\$100,000 federal; \$25,000 local match). Complete the update By November 2025 with Adoption.
- Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Section 5303 Planning Funds have been combined with Federal Highway Administration Planning Funds to be one (1) fund for better management.
- Funds pay for 5 full-time staff person's salaries, planning and programming work related to required documents, MPO administration and other federal requirements, general operating costs for meetings, advertising for meetings, public hearings and various other activities.
- Fiscal Years 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) will be amended as needed for FY-2026.
- Various other transportation planning duties such as, prior year authorized projects list reports and advertisement, overall GIS database update and maintenance and other associated GIS work related to planning and programming activities, traffic count updates, report writing, grant writing, etc....

After the discussion of the UPWP BUDGET SUMMARY HIGHLIGHTS, a motion was made by Mrs. Sankey to adopt and accept the agenda item, following a second by Mrs. Campbell Therefore, the agenda item passed unanimously and without any further discussion.

Agenda Item 7: Final Draft for Public Participation Plan (Action Item)

- Reviewed, evaluated updated overall Public Transportation Plan Document as a whole.
- The Public Participation Plan is generally still relevant as drafted.
- Updated all outdated information to current.

- Updated SAFETEA-LU Legislation to reflect IIJA Legislation.
- Added Virtual meetings as an option to meet during national emergencies and circumstances.
- Removed document review sites due to no activity of public coming in to review documents. Documents will continue to be made available on the MPO website and by email upon request.
- Contains timelines for involvement, outreach methods for all populations.
- The Public Participation Plan contains outreach methods for the MPO's main planning documents (LRTP), TIP, UPWP, etc).
- Contains all necessary and required items.

- (Montgomery County) Bridge Widening on I-85 (Northbound and Southbound) overLine Creek and Relief Bridges. (Working on ITS installations and punch list work 99.8 completion.
- (Montgomery County) Roadway Improvements (Roundabout Installations/Grading, Drainage, Pavement, Traffic Lighting, Traffic Signs and Traffic Stripe) On SR-126 at SR-8 (US-80 and on SR-8(US-80 at Marler Road East of Montgomery. (Working on Drainage Structures, and Base Materials.
- (Montgomery County) Pavement Preservation (Micro-Milling, Resurfacing, Guardrail installation, and Traffic Stripe) on I-85 from the Hall Street Overpass to 0.300 mile East of Ann Street interchange in Montgomery. (Working on Guardrail Permanent Stripe.
- (Montgomery County) Resurfacing, Bridge Guardrail retrofit, and Traffic Stripe on US-80) from the junction of SR-126 in Waugh to the Macon County Line. (Working on Upper Binder Leveling
- (Montgomery County) High Friction Surface Treatment and Traffic Stripe on Pelzer Avenue from the junction of Wareingwood Drive to junction of Honeysuckle Road in Montgomery (Punch list item being done)
- (Montgomery County) Intersection Improvements and Concrete Pavement on I-65 at the SR-6 (Southern Boulevard) Interchange in Montgomery. (Started Demo Work)
- (Autauga County) Roadway safety improvement (roadway pipe and slide repair) on I-65 (SB roadway at MP 191.000 southeast of Pine Level. (15% Did Punch list inspection discovered top of slope at slide need to be tied in closer to shoulder of roadway).
- (Autauga County) Micro- Milling, Resurfacing, Guardrail installation, and Traffic Stripe on SR-3 (US-31) from a point North of Alabama River Bridge (MP-186.300 to the Intersection of SR-6 (US-80). (Working on Wearing Surface and Concrete Islands. Waiting on procurement of Traffic Signal Poles.
- (Elmore County) Intersection Improvements and Traffic Installation on SR-14 at the 17 Springs entrance in Millbrook. (Asphalt and striping done, Waiting on Poles.
- (Elmore County) Planning, Resurfacing, Guardrail installation and stripe on SR-14 from the junction of Jackson Street in Elmore to the junction of SR—212 in Wetumpka. (Milling done. Rock ¾ complete. Wearing surface ¾ complete.

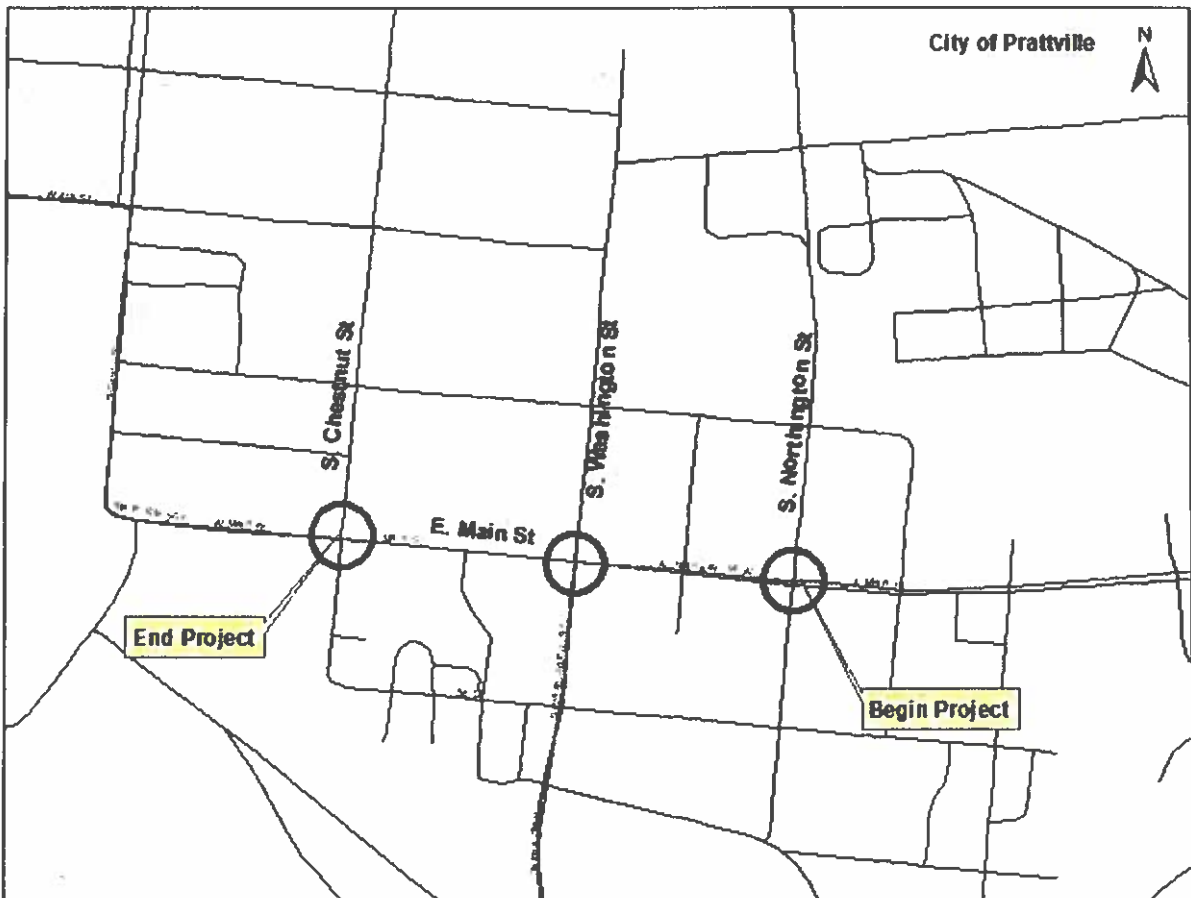




